#### 9.50 Introduction to the Weston Library

Mike Webb is Curator of Early Modern Archives and Manuscripts at the Bodleian. Formerly Head of Cataloguing in Western Manuscripts, he has curated three exhibitions in the library on the Tudor and Stuart gentry and nobility (1997), the Civil War (2000), and the First World War (2014).

#### 10.15 Local History from estate and manorial records: getting the best out of the Bodleian collections

Simon Townley has been County Editor of the Victoria County History since 1996, for which he has worked on numerous towns and villages, drawing partly on Bodleian collections. He is also a member of the OLHA committee.

#### 10.45 Maps for local history in the Bodleian

Nick Millea is curator of one of the ten largest collections of maps in the world. He has written books on sea charts, street mapping and mediaeval cartography and published numerous articles on map librarianship. He is also a Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society.

He was previously responsible, for over 20 years, for photographs in the Western Manuscripts department of the Bodleian.
