### 10.00 PARADISE LOST AND RESTORED: 400 YEARS OF GARDEN DESIGN IN OXFORDSHIRE

Gardener and botanist **Timothy Walker** will explore how the art of gardening has changed, or perhaps has not, in four centuries in Oxfordshire. He will take the Oxford Botanic Garden, of which he was director for twelve years, as an example of a garden which still bears all the hallmarks of 17th-century design, but which now also reflects design ideas of the 21st century. There will be a short break after the talk.

# 11.30 VOYAGES TO THE HOUSE OF DIVERSION: HANWELL CASTLE AND ITS SEVENTEENTH-CENTURY PARK

As part of a programme of doctoral research **Stephen Wass** has been investigating the remarkable 17th-century gardens at Hanwell, a site described by Robert Plot in his *Natural History of Oxfordshire* as a "real New Atlantis". His reference was to the community of like-minded individuals, gathered together by one Sir Anthony Cope, who made use of his garden to advance their understanding of contemporary science. As well as historical research, a series of archaeological excavations have revealed in the garden the site of Hanwell's 'House of Diversion' and recovered a unique assemblage of 17th-century terra-cotta urns, some of which will be on display.
