Henry, his three sons and subsequently his grandson, ran and greatly expanded the business until 1972, when Oxford City Council's plans to redevelop the whole St Ebbes and the Westgate area sounded the death knell for this much-loved Oxford institution. There will be a short break after the talk.
- 11:30 **BEFORE THE SUPERMARKET: SHOPPING IN THE POST-WAR OXFORD SUBURBS**Former Head of Oxfordshire Studies **Malcolm Graham** will introduce a remarkable collection of photographs taken in the late 1940s and 1950s by the City Council to monitor poster sites and street advertising.
